Highlights from Exceptional Trees of Long Beach

The August general meeting was hosted by Long Beach City College - Pacific Coast Campus. Our guest speaker for the day was Jorge Ochoa, Horticulture Department Chair. The program for the day was "Exceptional Trees of Long Beach". The initial meet and greet took place in the shady horticulture garden located on the campus.

To kick off the meeting, STS President John Conway introduced Thomas Shoots, CAL FIRE's Regional Urban Forester for the Los Angeles and Ventura regions. Thomas gave an update on the 2012-2013 urban forestry grants deadline (September 19th) and urged everyone to take advantage of the information and tools available on the CAL FIRE website.

The podium was passed on to Jorge, who gave a brief introduction to the Long Beach College Horticultural program and then took us into the classroom for his slide presentation. Throughout his talk on the historical and present-day trees of Long Beach, Jorge reminded us about the importance of trees in the urban landscape. Their branching structure, flowers, variety of canopy characteristics, and edible array of fruits and nuts all enhance the cityscape.

The native trees known to the pre-Spanish indigenous peoples, such as coast live oak, have been replaced in large part by a variety of domestic and exotic species that have

changed with the demographics of the city. Since 2009, Jorge and his team have walked the streets of Long Beach in search of the "unique", "largest", "oldest", and "one-of-a-kind specimen" trees within the city limits. While Jorge can use his "cuteness" to win over some of the residents with impressive private trees, public access is an important factor for inclusion on the outstanding tree list. With about 70% of the inventory completed to date, they have found numerous outstanding examples of both native and exotic tree species around town.

The remnant grounds of historic Rancho Los Cerritos and Rancho Los Alamitos contain some unique specimen trees, such as the only Osage orange (*Maclura pomifera*) known in southern California and the largest Italian stone

pine (*Pinus pinea*) in Long Beach. Rancho Los Alamitos is also home to a large valley oak (*Quercus lobata*), a Joshua tree (*Yucca brevifolia*), and the oldest Torrey pine (*Pinus torreyana*) in the city. Some of the unusual, one-of-a-kind trees found by Jorge and his staff include wild lime or wild prickly ash (*Zanthoxylum fagara*), Capulin cherry (*Prunus salicifolia*),

Chilean wine palm (*Jubaea chilensis*), Kukui tree (*Aleurites moluccana*), and a Traveler palm (*Ravenala madagascariensis*). Jorge's presentation included many more specimens that were unique to Long Beach based on geographical location, rarity, age, or stature. Another unusual aspect of Long Beach's urban forest is the number of fruit trees planted in the parkways. In his walks, Jorge has come across avocados, mangos, citrus, plums, apricots, and the less-common horseradish tree (*Moringa*)
