STREET TREE SEMINAR, INC. annually awards monetary scholarships to outstanding southern California college students. Our main goal is to see more active college graduates enter the urban forestry and arboriculture fields.

Application Process: Applicant must be a current student carrying a minimum of 12.0 units in a southern California area college majoring in the Arboriculture, Horticulture, or Natural Sciences field, with a keen interest in pursuing a career in Arboriculture/Urban Forestry.

Scholarship Amount: \$500.00 - \$1,500.00

Application Deadline: November 1, 2017

Oral Interviews: November 15, 2017

Announcement of Award: November 30, 2017

Presentation of Award: Scholarship awards will be presented at the December meeting of Street Tree Seminar. Recipients **must** attend presentation to receive award.

Selection Criteria: A combination of factors will be evaluated by a panel of professionals. These factors are as follows:

1. Grade Point Average (10%)
2. Academic & Community Involvement (15%)
3. Experience & Professional Involvement (15%)
4. Essay for Publication of Street Trees (15%)
5. Letter from Academic Advisor (10%)
6. Need of Financial Assistance (15%)
7. Oral Interview (20%)

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

Applicant's Statement: Applicant must submit a statement of no more than one page explaining why they want the scholarship, why they feel they should be selected as a recipient, why they chose their current field of study, their plans and goals for the future, how the scholarship monies will be used, their special interests, hobbies, and any other information that would interest the scholarship committee.

Community and School Involvement: List activities inside and outside the classroom; i.e., student government, clubs, sports, committees, volunteer work, youth organizations, citizen boards, etc. Included brief descriptions (if not well known), length and level of involvement, awards, honors, and positions held.

Work and Professional Involvement: List current employer, position held, and length of employment. Include all work experience within the last five (5) years. List professional associations, years of involvement, positions held, and any awards or honors received. Include participation on committees, task forces and other work-related activities.

An additional one sided page may be attached, if necessary, to complete the "involvement" statements.

Letter of Recommendation from Academic Advisor: Each application must contain a letter of recommendation from one Professor or Scholastic Advisor. Applicants may be asked to supply transcripts and references to support information included in application.

Essay or Report on the Importance of Street Trees: Each Scholarship Applicant is required to submit a one-page report or essay suitable for publication in the monthly newsletter of Street Tree Seminar along with the application form. (Only selected recipient=s essays will be published).

Oral Interview: Each finalist in the Scholarship Program is required to participate in an oral interview in front of the Street Tree Seminar Scholarship Committee. Candidates should be prepared to discuss their educational and professional goals.
